

Certification Exam and Safety Net Updates

ALST Exam:

On 3/13/17, the Board of Regents eliminated the ALST exam as well as the ALST safety net as a requirement for initial certification as an emergency measure. Candidates should NOT register for this exam. Candidates who have registered, but have not taken the ALST exam will be notified by NYSTCE and will be receiving a refund. If candidates have already taken the ALST exam, the exam registration fee will **not** be refunded. Further, the ALST exam result on candidates' TEACH accounts **will not** be removed. IF the ALST is the last requirement for certification, and/or if candidates applied for certification and were not certified prior to the elimination of the ALST **email:** examsafetynet@nysed.gov requesting the ALST to be **exempted** (include your first and last name; the last four digits of your social security number; and your date birth).

EAS and the edTPA Exam:

NYSED is currently working to modify both the EAS and the edTPA exams. Due to this, the EAS and the edTPA exam safety nets are **extended** for an undetermined length of time pending exam revisions.

REMINDER: Self-report ALL college education onto TEACH.
